Why Ethiopia?

Healing Hands of Joy operates in 38 of the most populous rural districts in Ethiopia, and in collaboration with each of the four regions' Health Bureaus.

Ethiopia has one of the highest rates of obstetric fistula in Sub-Saharan Africa. Half of all childbirth deliveries in rural Ethiopia occur at home, and your partnership *will* bring that number down to zero. The goal of zero is absolutely critical for safe motherhood.

Thanks to you, and the tireless work of the Ethiopian team and Safe Motherhood Ambassadors, Healing Hands of Joy is experiencing astounding growth.

In this year's Annual Report, you'll see how HHoJ is operating in 38 rural districts, with over 70 full-time Ethiopian staff, and continues to serve women and communities affected by the civil war in Northern Ethiopia.

The team behind the Emmy-winning film, *A Walk to Beautiful*, reunited to create a powerful new short film, *The Power of Joy*, sharing stories of survival, strength, and hope.

Financially, 2024 was a banner year! Your partnership helped HHoJ secure our largest grant to date, along with two other multi-year gifts. Income grew significantly, allowing services to grow by 11% beyond target.

Healing Hands of Joy is now honored to strategically partner with The Helmsley Charitable Trust. Thanks to a gift from the Pinetops Foundation, we worked with Mission Increase to develop a 4-year strategic plan that strengthens operations and explores new regions for expansion.

To help support this next chapter, Cindy Breilh joined the U.S. leadership team as Operations Director. A longtime supporter and former Board member, Cindy brings decades of leadership and deep commitment to this mission.

None of this work would be possible without the Ethiopian team, whose grassroots work has been recognized by Ethiopia's new Minister of Health, Dr. Mekdes Daba, an OBGYN herself!

A Safe Motherhood Ambassador influences 90 women at risk of obstetric fistula on average. This means 2024's new graduates will reach around 36.180 women!

This stability enables Aster to concentrate on her responsibilities as an SMA, and she was able to identify a hidden case of obstetric fistula in her very own community.

Despite instability and economic strain, the Healing Hands of Joy team remained unstoppable-traveling by public transport, reaching remote communities, and ensuring pregnant women received lifesaving care. Thriving in the Face of Adversity

Married at 12, Hager Melkinew endured six pregnancies and suffered an obstetric fistula during her last prolonged labor. She lived with the condition for over a year, isolated and dependent, until she received surgery at Mettu Hamlin Fistula Hospital and was introduced to Healing Hands of Joy.

Through HHoJ's Safe Motherhood Ambassador (SMA) training, Hager gained skills, counseling, and confidence. "I am healed, physically and emotionally," she shared.

"I'm free from the pain and stress of obstetric fistula. I'm happy and working hard to improve my life. Stay blessed!"

Thanks to iZosh: Women Investing in Women in partnership with Healing Hands of Joy, Hager received four sheep to start a small business. Despite setbacks from disease, she sought help, vaccinated her flock, and rebuilt. She now owns nine sheep and a donkey, which helps her transport goods to market without the risk of injuring herself.

A staff mid-term visit found Hager thriving. She has since sold more sheep, bought a cow, and now has lambs and a calf providing milk for her family.

"I am so thankful to HHoJ. I feel like the staff are my family! And owning a donkey? For me, it's like having a truck!"

Reunited for

Twenty years after A Walk to Beautiful brought global attention to obstetric fistula in Ethiopia and helped inspire the founding of Healing Hands of Joy, filmmakers Amy Bucher, Mary Olive "Mo" Smith, and Allison Shigo returned to Tigray to tell the next chapter.

Before the war began in 2020, Healing Hands of Joy was preparing to exit the region. Fistula rates had dropped 80% since 2005. But civil unrest devastated maternal healthcare; forcing many women to give birth in caves increasing the incidence of fistula, and to rely soley on courageous community members like Safe Motherhood Ambassador Nigisty to help save lives.

Now, as the region rebuilds, The Power of Joy—an 11-minute film—shares stories of survival and hope. Thanks to partners like Tejemos and The Helmsley Charitable Trust, safe motherhood is once again a priority, bringing healing, dignity, and renewed hope to women and communities in Tigray.

"The Power of Joy was incredibly inspiring and deepened my understanding of the vital work being done to make motherhood safe in Ethiopia. I'm committed to supporting this important cause and will definitely share the film."



2024 Income: \$2,114,907*


*Income includes a \$250,000 grant restricted for 2025. Financials are unaudited, and the 2024 financial audit will be posted on our website
